#### **CONCLUSION**

There were 17,563 total police-reported crimes<sup>1</sup> in Regina in 2014, which was 0.8% fewer than the 17,711 in 2013 and 32.2% fewer than the 25,904 in 2005. This was Regina's lowest annual crime count over the last 10 years. However, despite this slight overall decrease compared to 2013, there were increases in the categories of Crimes Against the Person (+3.3%) and Crimes Against Property (+1.3%). The slight decrease in total crime compared to 2013 was due to a decrease in Other Criminal Code offences (-4.9%).

#### **BACKGROUND**

Twice each year, once at mid-year and once at year-end, the Regina Police Service provides an analysis of reported crime in Regina over the previous ten-year period. This report compares data compiled from January 1 to December 31 for the period of 2005 through 2014.

Measuring crime statistics over time is effective for identifying trends. Data is gathered in the same manner each year to ensure the analysis is reliable. Absolute crime counts, rather than crime rates or crime severity, are the basis of this analysis.

These statistics are not intended for comparison with other jurisdictions that may use different methodologies or have different reporting criteria.



<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Total Crime is an account of Crimes Against the Person, Crimes Against Property, and Other Criminal Code violations only. Criminal Code Traffic and the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act offences are excluded from this total. These same categories are excluded from the Crime Rate released by Statistics Canada each year.


## Total Crime

The 17,563 reported Total Crime in 2014 was a slight decrease of 0.8% from 2013 and a decrease of 32.2% from 2005.




## Crimes Against the Person

The 2,602 reported Crimes Against the Person in 2014 was an increase of 3.3% from 2013 but a 30.2% decrease from 2005.




There were 5 Homicides and 11 Attempted Murders in 2014. The average number of Homicides per year over this ten-year period was 7.0 and the average number of attempted murders was 11.6.




Total reported Assault<sup>2</sup> increased by 2.9% from 2013 but decreased by 24.1% from 2005.

Common Assault decreased by 3.4% from 2013 and by 30.5% from 2005. Assault with a Weapon or Causing Bodily Harm increased by 10.3% from 2013 but decreased by 22.7% from 2005. Aggravated Assault increased by 25.4% from 2013 and by 60.9% from 2005.




<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Assault 1, or common assault, occurs when one person applies force or threatens to apply force to another person. This may include gestures, physical pushing or a threatening act and often results in little to no physical harm to the victim. Assault 2, or assault with a weapon or causing injury, occurs when there is an injury to the victim either caused by force of another person or the result of a weapon. Assault 3, or aggravated assault, is the most severe type of assault which causes serious injury to the victim that may endanger their life.

Sexual Assault<sup>3</sup> increased by 16.1% from 2013 but decreased by 20.4% from 2005. The 23 Other Sex Crime offences in 2014 were higher than the 10-year average of 16.0.




There was a 6.7% increase in Robbery from 2013 but a 49.0% decrease from 2005.


There were 22 occurrences of Kidnapping / Forcible Confinement in 2014, which was slightly higher than the 10-year average of 19.6.

There were 16 occurrences of Criminal Harassment / Stalking in 2014, which was the lowest count in the past decade and substantially lower than the 10-year average of 34.3.




## Crimes Against Property


Total Crimes Against Property has been relatively stable over the last three years. The 10,351 reported occurrences in 2014 were an increase of 1.3% from 2013 but a decrease of 39.1% from 2005.




There was little change in the number of reported Motor Vehicle Theft (which includes attempted theft) with 2 more reported occurrences in 2014 than in 2013, which is an increase of 0.2%. Over the last decade, however, there was a reduction of 60.3%.




There was an increase in Theft of 6.1% compared to 2013 but a 31.8% decrease over the last decade.




Total Break and Enter occurrences increased by 10.6% from 2013, comprised of a 12.1% increase in residential Break and Enter, a 12.5% increase in Break and Enter to businesses, and an 8.0% increase to Break and Enter of other structures. However, there has been a 53.7% decrease in total Break and Enter since 2005.



The number of reported Mischief / Willful Damage occurrences decreased by 3.8% from 2013 and by 24.5% since 2005. There were 394 incidents of Graffiti (a sub-category of Mischief) in 2014, which accounted for 16.6% of all Mischief incidents.




There was a decrease of 37.1% in Arson occurrences from 2013 and a 41.1% decrease compared to 2005.




#### Other Criminal Code Violations

The 4,604 Other Criminal Code<sup>4</sup> occurrences in 2014 was a decrease of 4.9% from 2013 and 11.0% from 2005.




<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> The crime category Other Criminal Code Violations includes: procedural violations, offensive weapons violations, prostitution, counterfeiting currency, and gaming and betting.

Procedural violations make up the majority of Other Criminal Code violations. Breach of Probation, Fail to Attend Court, and Bail Violations combined to account for almost 90% of all Other Criminal Code violations in 2014. There were 7.3% fewer procedural offences than in 2013 but 5.1% more than in 2005.




There were only 6 Prostitution offences in 2014, which was substantially lower than in any other year in the last decade. This sharp decline was due to Supreme Court striking down the existing Prostitution legislation. Parliament developed new Prostitution legislation (Bill C-36), which was implemented on December 6, 2014.




#### Controlled Drugs & Substances Act (CDSA) & Traffic

The number of CDSA occurrences decreased by 25.2% from 2013 to 2014. Over the last decade, there has been an increase of 22.1% in CDSA occurrences.




The total number of Traffic occurrences under the Criminal Code or provincial Highway Traffic Act decreased by 16.1% compared to 2013, though there has been an increase of 23.4% compared to 2005.


Previous to 2009, reports of unexplained vehicular damage were taken as the Criminal Code offence 'Failure to Stop or Remain' (Hit and Run). Following a best practices review and consultation with SGI, such reports are no longer classified as a Criminal Hit and Run unless evidence exists of intent to flee the scene of a vehicular collision by an offending party. Instead, most of these reports now fall under the Highway Traffic Act offence 'Fail to Report MVA / Property Damage.'



The number of Impaired Drive occurrences increased by 4.4% from 2013 and by 77.3% from 2005. The higher number of Impaired Drive occurrences can partially be attributed to increased enforcement efforts and partnerships between the Regina Police Service and SGI, such as the Enforcement Overdrive and Report Impaired Drivers (RID) programs.



The number of Traffic Tickets<sup>5</sup> issued in 2014 decreased by 25.5% compared to 2013 and 12.0% compared to 2005. This reduction in 2014 was primarily due to personnel shortages within the Traffic section related to three long-term injuries and one maternity leave.



#### Calls for Service

There were 1.5% fewer Calls for Service recorded by the Communications Centre in 2014 than in 2013 and 6.3% fewer than in 2005.

Alarm calls decreased by 10.9% compared to 2013, continuing the reductions that have occurred since the Regina False Alarm Bylaw went into force in 2005. Over the last decade, there has been a decrease in Alarm calls for service of 42.5%. Despite these substantial reductions, Alarm calls remain the most common call type received by the Regina Police.



## **SUMMARY**

Crime in Regina continued to decline in 2014, though the decrease compared to the previous year was slight. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property both experienced modest increases whereas Other Criminal Code offences had a modest decrease.

#### RECOMMENDATION

#### **CONCLUSION**

The crime statistics for the month of December 2014 reflect an increase in Crimes Against the Person of 3.3% compared to December 2013, while Crimes Against Property show a 1.3% increase compared to December 2013. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 1.7%.

## **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of December 2014. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

#### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect an increase of 133 reported incidents over 2013, for an overall year-to-date increase of 1.3%. We have seen an increase of 271 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a 6.1% increase. There are (-95) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-3.8%) decrease year-to-date.

Thefts of Auto rates have increased by 2 incidents for an overall increase of 0.2% in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date increase of 82 incidents over December 2014 for a 3.3% increase. There were 21 reported Robberies in December for a year-to-date increase of 15 incidents or an increase of 6.7%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received a increase of 215 reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2014 over 2013 incidents for a 1.7% increase.

There were a total of 4666 dispatched Calls for Service in December for a year-to-date reduction of (-1.5%) and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-10.9%.).

#### **CONCLUSION**

The crime statistics for the month of January 2015 reflect an increase in Crimes Against the Person of 4.8% compared to January 2014, while Crimes Against Property show a 7.0% increase compared to January 2014. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 6.5%.

## **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of January 2015. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

#### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect an increase of 43 reported incidents over 2014, for an overall year-to-date increase of 7.0%. We have seen an increase of 19 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a 6.9% increase. There are (-37) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-25.5%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by 12 incidents for an overall decrease of (-21.1%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date increase of 9 more incidents over January 2014 for a 4.8% increase. There were 18 reported Robberies in January for a year-to-date decrease of (-2) incidents or a decrease of (-10.0%).

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 52 more reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2015 over 2014 incidents for a 6.5% increase

There were a total of 4,679 dispatched Calls for Service in January for a year-to-date increase of 8.9% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-15.9%).

#### **CONCLUSION**

The crime statistics for the month of February 2015 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-4.0%) compared to February 2014, while Crimes Against Property show a (-3.20%) decrease compared to February 2014. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of (-3.3%).

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of February 2015. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

#### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of 75 reported incidents over 2014, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-3.20%). We have seen a decrease of 21 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-0.6%) decrease. There are (-25) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-23.1%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by 20 incidents for an overall decrease of (-18.9%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of 14 fewer incidents over February 2014 for a (-4.0%) decrease. There were 20 reported Robberies in February for a year-to-date increase of 2 incidents or an increase of 5.9%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 51 fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2015 over 2014 incidents for a (-3.3%) decrease.

There were a total of 4,072 dispatched Calls for Service in February for a year-to-date increase of 5.0% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of (-17.1%).

Good afternoon Chief Hagen, Mr. Crumley, S/Sgt. Layman and Ms. Curry,

Let me start by apologizing for the lateness of this email. I have been meaning for quite some time to contact you all, as well as Cpl. Kelly Gorman, Cpl. Tim Filazek and the members of the Regina Autism Unit, to thank you for the exemplary collaborative efforts in two areas:

- 1. the Regina Children's Justice Center (Cpl. Gorman and Cpl. Filazek in particular) and the Regina Autism Unit of Child and Youth Services for working together to address and respond to a case involving a boy with an Autism Spectrum Disorder ("ASD") that was in our system with criminal charges in September of 2014; and
- 2. the Saskatchewan Police College and the Regina Autism Unit of Child and Youth Services for their collaborative efforts to initiate training and awareness for our new municipal Police Officers in the province, specific to the challenges faced by people with ASD to facilitate the recognition of those people (and their behaviors) during police related encounters.

In September 2014, Cpl. Gorman contacted me for advice relating to a boy with an ASD that was then under release conditions with charges that were understandably concerning for his parents, as well as the parents of the youthful complainants. I provided Cpl. Gorman with my basic understanding of the behaviors that he and Cpl. Filazek were observing in the youthful accused, and a contact at the Regina Autism Unit with a view to determining whether resources could be devoted to supporting and assisting the boy and his parents in the community. Cpl. Gorman contacted the Regina Autism Unit and I understand that collective efforts were made to reach out and provide support, counselling and education for the family of the boy. Cpl. Gorman and Cpl. Filazek were receptive to my advice that the criminal charges could be resolved with informal mediation, and I understand that they followed through appropriately with the families involved and ultimately the charges did not proceed to court. The public interest was met with sensitivity to both the complainants involved and the particular needs of the accused youth and his family.

During my discussions with Cpl. Gorman, I recalled consulting with a number of other Police Officers and Crown Prosecutors over the preceding 12 months on several cases involving youthful accused persons with ASD challenges of one type or another. It occurred to me that we were seeing more of these individuals coming into contact with Police and the criminal justice system, and that perhaps it was an appropriate time to consider incorporating an ASD component into our Police College training curriculum. The aim was to better prepare our Police Officers for encounters in their communities with such people. The Director of the Saskatchewan Police College, Mitch Crumley, and the Director of Child and Youth Services, Glenna Curry, were receptive to the proposal. Together, and with assistance from the professionals in their respective organizations, they seized the idea and created a Police College training curriculum, an RPS School Resource Officer training session, and other initiatives that far surpassed the initial vision.

Attached above are an overview of the Police College curriculum on "ASD and the Criminal Justice System" and an Autism Centre Newsletter introducing the new initiatives to the communities served by the Centre (see page 4). The collaborative efforts of the multiple people involved in these laudable initiatives are to be recognized and commended. Please accept my thanks and convey my gratitude to all the individuals from your respective agencies that were involved in the specific case in 2014, as well as those involved in developing and delivering the training programs for the Police College and the RPS School Resource Officers. I appreciate their time, effort and commitment to these collaborative undertakings that ensure that justice is done in individual cases, and enhance our police services through greater knowledge and understanding of persons with ASD.
