CONCLUSION

A full data summary of the Canadian Centre of Justice Statistics (CCJS) report *Police-reported crime in Canada*, 2014 has been embargoed by Statistics Canada until 6:30am (8:30am EST) on July 22, 2015. Due to the embargo, the Regina Police Service (RPS) is unable to release the full report with the agenda prior to the Board of Police Commissioners meeting. A supplemental report including the released data will be added to the agenda at the beginning of the meeting, for consideration by the Board, and copies will be available for the public and media.

BACKGROUND

CCJS, a branch of Statistics Canada, releases an annual report detailing police-reported crime in Canada for the previous year, as well as some comparative data from previous years. Police-reported crime statistics are provided at the national, provincial, and Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) level within the report.

Statistics Canada and CCJS impose an embargo on crime data until its official public release. Select members of police services across Canada are granted early access to the report under strict confidentiality agreements in order to proof-read the report and to prepare communications for when the data is made publicly available. Each year, the RPS utilizes this early access to prepare a summary report for the public that focuses on the Regina CMA's crime statistics.

DISCUSSION

By chance, the *Police-reported crime in Canada, 2014* report and related crime data will not be publicly released by Statistics Canada until July 22, 2015, the day of the Board of Police Commissioners monthly meeting. The RPS wishes to deliver its summary of the CCJS report during the Public Session of the monthly Board meeting for the sake of convenience since both the Board and local news media will be in attendance. However, due to the embargo, the RPS is unable to provide the full report in advance. Instead, a supplemental report including the released data will be added to the agenda at the beginning of the meeting, for consideration by the Board, and copies will be available for the public and media.

The Regina Police Service is committed to becoming increasingly reflective of the community it serves.

BACKGROUND

The Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission (SHRC) provides the Regina Police Service with Employment Equity Reporting Guidelines. The SHRC asked sponsors to provide the following information:

- 1. Workforce data (statistical report); and
- 2. A brief narrative description of significant actions taken to implement the organization's equity plan.

These two components constitute the sponsor's annual monitoring report. The Regina Police Service has been asked to provide the current report by June 30, 2015. Please refer to the attached for a copy of the Regina Police Service's Employment Equity Plan 2014 Annual Report.

The SHRC posts sponsor reports on its equity site. This promotes the transparency and accountability of equity programs and facilitates information sharing and networking.

Since the inception of the Regina Police Service plan in 1992, employment equity totals have increased over the years. A comparison of progress from 1992 thru to 2014 along with SHRC 2014 Goals is as follows:

DISCUSSION

In 2014 the Regina Police Service continued to demonstrate management commitment and leadership towards a representative workforce and inclusive work environment.

The Regina Police Service's 2011-2014 Strategic Plan continues to support our equity initiatives through Recruiting and Employee Development goals, which will have "...a focus on First Nations and newcomer communities." Human Resources will continue to monitor the Regina Police Service workforce demographic analysis and proactively address trends impacting the SHRC 2015 employment equity objectives. The Regina Police Service will continue to focus recruiting efforts on areas to maximize diversity applicants.

The Regina Police Service entered a 20 year agreement with the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission. In 2012, the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission extended the agreement indefinitely on the condition that the reporting guidelines were met on an annual basis.

Executive Summary

The following report is the Regina Police Service's Employment Equity Annual Report for 2014. It is submitted in accordance with the Employment Equity Reporting Guidelines (SHRC File: A2089) of the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission (SHRC).

This report includes the required workforce data (statistical reports) and a narrative report of significant actions taken in 2014 to enhance the organization's equity plan.

The Regina Police Service's Strategic Plan (2011-2014) continues to support, foster and promote a respect for individual rights, freedoms and multicultural diversities within our community and within our workplace. A summary of the objectives set out in this plan are included in this report.

Part I: Workforce Data

In 1992 the Regina Police Service identified that the demographic of Regina was changing and in order to more effectively provide service it would be beneficial to have a workforce that reflected the community. An agreement was entered with the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission (SHRC) and since this time, the Regina Police Service has been striving to achieve a representative workforce.

This report complies with the annual reporting requirements for continued approval of this agreement.

In 2014, the following figures were provided by the SHRC as their recommended goals¹:

Every year, the Regina Police Service modifies their goals to match those set out by the SHRC.


¹ The SHRC introduced new goals for 2014, the first change since 2010. Previous goals were: Women in underrepresented occupations – 47.0%; Aboriginal People – 13.1%; People with disabilities – 9.7%; Visible Minorities – 6.6%.

The table below provides an overview of the Regina Police Service's progress in obtaining the SHRC goals.

^{**}The Increase in the People with Disabilities category is a result of more individuals requiring accommodation in the 2014 calendar year. This number fluctuates based on the Service's accommodation needs.



Part II: Strategic Plan

The Regina Police Service's 2011–2014 Strategic Plan embraces equity initiatives and directives. The Regina Police Service Strategic Plan states support of the Employment Equity Program by "enhancing recruitment of qualified personnel while striving to meet the goals set forth by the Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission (SHRC)". The following initiatives are included in the Strategic Plan under Recruitment and Employee Development (RED).

RED1.1 Continuing to implement the Human Resource Strategic Plan, with a focus on Aboriginal and newcomer communities by clearly defining the recruiting direction of RPS and the community at large.

RED4.4 To deliver cultural training to all staff that is reflective of Regina's diversity. The bi-annual training will include information on Regina's newcomer populations and ensure recommendations from The Commission on First Nations and Métis Peoples and Justice Reform and The Commission into Matters Relating to the Death of Neil Stonechild related to cultural training are reflected in the delivery practice and course content of cultural training offered by the RPS. The recommendations are:

"This Commission recommends that all police services invite members of the First Nations and Métis communities to evaluate the effectiveness of existing cultural awareness programs and implement changes as required." (The Commission on First Nations and Métis Peoples and Justice Reform-Recommendation 5.2)

"That municipal police officers receive in-depth training in race relations. The training should include information about Aboriginal culture, history, societal and family structures. A refresher course

should be provided every three years. It is important that course leaders include Aboriginal peace officers, including members of the RCMP. (The Commission into Matters Relating to the Death of Neil Stonechild-Recommendation 7)

Bi-annual environmental scans are also conducted to determine if there are any current issues that can and need to be addressed through on-going training.



Part III: Cultural and Community Diversity Initiatives

The Cultural and Community Diversity Unit of the Regina Police Service is integral in the development and maintenance of community partnerships and initiatives. The unit consists of three sworn members (one Corporal, two Constables) and one civilian.

The members of this unit sit on many internal and external boards and committees. They work closely with community organizations such as the Open Door Society, Immigrant Women, RTSIS (Regina Treaty Status Indian Services), the Regina Multicultural Council, the Mosque, the Synagogue, University of Regina Pride Centre and Saskatchewan Polytechnic, to name a few. They also assist officers on a daily basis with any challenges they may face in relation to understanding different cultures and traditions. The unit has a strong working relationship with the Newcomer and Aboriginal communities. The Unit continues to maintain these relationships as well as develop new connections.

Some of the major initiatives accomplished by the unit in 2014 are listed below.

Regina Police Service Tipi

In 1997 the Regina Police Service acquired a traditional tipi for use as a cultural bridge between the Service and the community. This tipi is 'sacred' and is only used in accordance with First Nations traditions.

The tipi is utilized to participate in special events in the First Nations Community. In 2014, these events included the Missing and Murdered Aboriginal Women's Vigil, Cultural Awareness Night (Pats Hockey) in respect and memory of veteran and Elder Howard Anderson, the North American Indigenous Games and Treaty Days in Fort Qu'Appelle.



Regina Multicultural Council

The Cultural and Community Diversity unit maintains many partnerships with community based organizations. One of these is the Regina Multicultural Council. The unit has a satellite location at the Council office on Thursdays from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.



Chiefs Elder Advisory Council

In 1998, the Chief of Police formed an Elders Advisory Committee.

The Council consists of twelve elders who are invited to participate.

They're involved in Aboriginal ceremonies and participate in the strategic

planning process. The Council provides oversight and guidance in matters relating to Aboriginal culture and ceremony.

Round Dance

In February of 2014, the Regina Police Service hosted the 8th Annual Round Dance. The Round Dance is a social gathering of communities that occurs during the winter months to honour, celebrate and memorialize. The gathering is an interaction between the community and police officers in a traditional setting to demonstrate the Service's willingness to take part in and understand the traditional values of the Aboriginal community.

The 2014 Round Dance had approximately 1300 participants from many Aboriginal communities and the Regina Police Service. Laurie Whiteman, co-founder Sisters In Spirit in Regina, was honoured with an eagle feather for her work with missing and murdered Aboriginal women.




Cadet Program

In 2014, the Regina Police Service continued a partnership with the Wicihitowin Foundation Inc. and RCMP to deliver the 10th class of Community Cadet Corps (CCC) in the North Central Community. There were 13 cadets in the 2014 class.

The CCC was developed by the RCMP and was modeled after the Air/Army Cadet programs. The goal was to provide youth aged 12-18, who are active in school, the opportunity to learn discipline and goal setting. Although there is a strong military component which includes drill and marching, there is also a sport and recreational component which allows for fun, healthy competition and teamwork.

The CCC is targeted to youth who display behaviours which make them more likely to come in contact with the law.

Cultural Relations Officers from the Cultural and Community Diversity Unit provide oversight and leadership to the cadets in this program.



ESL (English as a Second Language) Program

in 2014, Cultural Officers began delivering presentations to the ESL classes held at the Regina Public Library and Saskatchewan Polytechnic. This is a new partnership which will be maintained and developed further. These presentations provide newcomers with an orientation to policing in Canada in an attempt to better prepare them for any interaction they might have and to reduce the fear of police.

Other Community Events

Each year, the Regina Police Service also participates in many other community events to develop relationships with organizations committed to inclusion. In 2014, these included but were not limited to:

- Members from the Community Services Division participated in the Indian Metis Fellowship Garden Chili Cup.
- Organizational participation in the Imagine....No Bullies campaign.
- Organized and participated in the Sisters in Spirit Missing Women's Vigil.
- Participation in the First Nations University of Canada Spring and Fall Pow Wows.
- Participated in the 2nd annual event called "CluedInClude" in partnership with the Open Door Society, Regina Treaty Indian Status Services and the Multicultural Council.
- Participated in a Smudge Walk hosted by the Chamber of Commerce.
- Participated in the University of Regina Pride Week, including the Positive Space Network training.
- Participated in the Queen City Pride Parade this was the first year members participated in uniform.

- Assist with organization of the annual Mosaic Festival and have an increased presence during the event.
- Participated in National Aboriginal Day events at Wascana Park,
 Circle Project and the Paul Dojack Youth Centre.
- Shared a booth with the Regina Open Door Society at the Regina Police Showcase event in May 2014.
- Members provided transportation, mentorship and delivered workshops on hate crimes and bullying at Camp Fyrefly.
- Meetings with the Islamic Association and their Board continued along with an invitation to share information on domestic violence with their women's group.
- Participated in the Santa Clause Parade using the Regina Police Service float with the assistance of the Aboriginal Police Preparation Program students from Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the Community Cadet Corps.
- Diversity training was delivered to members as a part of annual block training. This training included an Aboriginal component with teachings on the meaning behind sweetgrass, tobacco and Elders.
 There was also a component on newcomer issues that focused on religion versus culture and honour based violence.

Part IV: Recruitment and HR

SPARC

The Saskatchewan Police Aboriginal Recruiting Committee (SPARC) was formed in 2006. It comprised of multi-police and partner agencies committed to implementing diverse and non-discriminatory recruitment and retention practices for police services in Saskatchewan. SPARC works toward identifying barriers to employment, preparing Aboriginal candidates to achieve success in policing careers and establishing police services in Saskatchewan as employers of choice. The Committee anticipates that its practices and goals will serve as a model to increase diversity of all ethnicities, cultures and backgrounds throughout Saskatchewan police services.

In 2014, the Committee furthered the development of promotional material to include a bookmark and pamphlet for handing out at career fairs.

Saskatchewan Polytechnic – Aboriginal Police Preparation Program


Through involvement with SPARC, the Regina Police Service has developed a partnership with Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the Aboriginal Police Preparation Program. This program runs for 30 weeks and is offered in Prince Albert, Saskatoon and Regina. Although involvement is focused on the Regina class, recruiting presentations are also made to the Saskatoon and Prince Albert classes.

The recruiting officer makes frequent visits to the Regina campus, allowing relationship building with students.

Treaty Four Citizen's Police Academy

In 2014, the Regina Police Service coordinated and delivered the 10th annual Treaty Four Citizen's Police Academy. In partnership with members of SPARC, Aboriginal candidates were invited to participate in a two week workshop held in May at the Saskatchewan Police College. Candidates are required to stay in residence and attend classes and training in an effort to simulate the experience of Police College and increase their knowledge of policing in Saskatchewan. Candidates are identified through contacts in the Aboriginal community. The Tribal Councils actively support this initiative of promoting policing within the Aboriginal community and within municipal and RCMP police services.

In 2014, there were nine participants in the Treaty Four Citizen's Police Academy.



Blue and Beyond

In April of 2014, recruiters held an information night targeting women interested in policing. Advertising was done through social media and the Regina Police Service website. There were 22 candidates present for the evening.

Mentorship Program

In September 2008, the Regina Police Service implemented a mentorship program. The mandate of this program is to increase the number of sworn diversity employees within the Service and to provide an opportunity to coach and develop prospective employees to increase the probability of success. Areas of development include but are not limited to: fitness, report writing, and public speaking. To date the program has mentored six individuals, four of whom are now police members and one who is a civilian member.

In 2014, the seventh mentorship candidate successfully transitioned through the selection process and attended the Saskatchewan Police College from August 2014 to December 2014. The candidate is currently completing his field training.



Summer Students

An Aboriginal/Diversity Summer Student program was implemented in 2004. Initially the program targeted Aboriginal students but in 2011 was expanded to include visible minority candidates. Funding is in place for three students for four months each summer. Positions vary by organizational need but generally include entry level clerical or

Information Technology positions. Two of the original summer student candidates are now employed full time while several others have remained as casual employees while they complete their education.

Working Environment

The Regina Police Service is working to educate employees about the importance of maintaining a work life balance. Through an in house Wellness Coordinator and an effective Employee Family Assistance Program, the focus is on general physical health and emotional wellness. There has been research done into sabbaticals, external work exchanges, job shadowing and job sharing as possible opportunities for the Regina Police Service to enhance employee work life balance.

Retention and Career Development

All members are encouraged to discuss their career plans with their supervisors. Likewise, supervisors are encouraged to engage their members/staff in career discussions. Employees may forward requests for training to Human Resources for consideration at any time. Career goal discussions between employee and supervisors are documented as part of the performance management process. The documents are forwarded to Human Resources for tracking and training considerations.

Part V: Going Forward

In 2015 the Regina Police Service will continue to maintain and develop relationships that enhance diversity, within our workforce and in the community. Some of the actions planned to assist us in achieving our goals are:

- Continue recruiting efforts in diversity areas by targeting female organized sports teams, diversity career fairs, and outreach to diversity educational and community groups.
- Continue the female recruiting information night (Blue and Beyond)
 in the fall of 2015 with the possibility of expanding the scope of the
 event.
- Continue participating on SPARC.
- Increase our representation at career fairs targeting Aboriginal student communities.
- Continue to partner with PRIDE (Centre for Sexuality and Gender Diversity) at the University of Regina on awareness and education.
- Continue to deliver training in key areas in relation to cultural diversity.
- Continue involvement in the Cadet Program, Treaty Four Citizen's
 Police Academy, Round Dance and other community events which
 the Regina Police Service participates in, as well as seeking new
 opportunities to expand relationships.
- Continue with existing diversity development programs such as the Mentorship and Summer Student programs.

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of May 2015 reflect an increase in Crimes Against the Person of 1.5% compared to May 2014, while Crimes Against Property show a (-2.6%) decrease compared to May 2014. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of (-1.7%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of May 2015. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-95) reported incidents over 2014, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-2.6%). We have seen a decrease of 32 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-2.0%) decrease. There are (-93) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-10.4%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by 45 incidents for an overall decrease of (-14.4%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date increase of 15 more incidents over May 2014 for a 1.5% increase. There were 15 reported Robberies in May for a year-to-date increase of 12 incidents or an increase of 15.0%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 80 fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2015 over 2014 incidents for a (-1.7%) decrease.

There were a total of 5,431 dispatched Calls for Service in May for a year-to-date increase of 4.3% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of [-19.7%].

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of June 2015 reflect an increase in Crimes Against the Person of 1.3% compared to June 2014, while Crimes Against Property show a (-0.2%) decrease compared to June 2014. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 0.1%.

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of June 2015. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect a decrease of (-9) reported incidents over 2014, for an overall year-to-date decrease of (-0.2%). We have seen a decrease of 31 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a (-1.5%) decrease. There are (-46) fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a (-4.2%) decrease.

Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by 13 incidents for an overall decrease of (-3.4%) in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date increase of 16 more incidents over June 2014 for a 1.3% increase. There were 21 reported Robberies in June for a year-to-date increase of 10 incidents or an increase of 9.6%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 7 more reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2015 over 2014 incidents for a 0.1% increase.

There were a total of 5,791 dispatched Calls for Service in June for a year-to-date increase of 4.1% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of [-19.7%].



Thanks loads for the advice and support you provided me with when I phoned you yesterday. Your advice will be heeded 100%,

Although it is now over 4 years since the neighbour's pit bull attacked me on my driveway, I am still afraid. The sore on my left hand took over 6 weeks to heel and the \$27 gloves were toast. Lucky for me, at that time, I turned and saw the pit bull with mouth open in attack mode. I was able to get my fist clenched and I was lucky he attacked my fist and not my nose, cheek or jugular.

I guess one would have to ask the lady in the picture enclosed how she gets by without a nose, after being attacked by a pit bull. Or one could ask the chap from Illinois how he gets by without his hands — one they had to amputate because of a pit bull attack — the other one the pit bull amputated. I wonder how the relatives of the 8 people in Florida feel after their loved ones were killed by pit bulls.

I guess it will take us a while to understand that this breed of dog is dangerous and should be banned like they have done in most of England. I have owned or co-owned six dogs from collie to spaniel. Not one ever bit a person or put a neighbour (Darryl Chapman across the street) out of work for 4 months like the pit bull next door.

QMI AGENCY — A woman whose nose was ripped off by a pitbull has been boosted by the generosity of strangers after Quebec ruled that she's ineligible for a publicly funded prosthetic nose.

Marie-Helene Tokar was disfigured when a neighbour's dog jumped her in 2008 and tore off her nose near her home in Saint-Hippolyte, Que. She was rushed to hospital where doctors tried to reconstruct her nose with skin grafts, but the new skin did not take.

Tokar's plastic surgeon suggested she be fitted with a prosthetic nose, but medicare says it only covers the bills of people who have lost their noses to cancer, not dog attacks.

"Since the accident, I've gone \$70,000 into debt," said Tokar. She was deluged with support after QMI Agency published a French-language story on her ordeal last week. Several people have even offered to help pay for her surgery.

Pit bulls attack cop

A RCMP officer was attacked by three pit bulls Friday as she helped paramedics get into a home on the Mt. Currie Reserve to attend to a victim who had been bitten earlier that morning.

The incident comes just weeks before the Lil'wat Nation is set to launch a program to curb the number of stray dogs roaming the reserve, said Chief Lucinda Phillips. "Dog control has been a bit of an issue in the community over the years," she said. "We have taken steps with partners...to encourage spaying and neutering and dog control and the collection of stray dogs for adoption."

Paramedics contacted the Stl'atl'imx Tribal Police for backup after they were called to the home on the reserve near Pemberton at about 6:30 a.m. with reports that a pit bull had

attacked a neighbour.

When the RCMP officer, who works for the tribal police, approached the home, two tied-up pit bulls became vicious. The officer attempted to back them up so the paramedics could walk past them, but a third unleashed dog attacked her from behind, knocking her to the ground.

A resident who knew the dogs tried to help her, but was bit too. The officer, still on the ground, continued to fight back until the resident managed to get the pit bulls into kennels.

The male victim, whose face and arm were punctured, and the officer were rushed to the Pemberton Medical Clinic.

The officer was released later that afternoon, but the man remained in hospital.

"He had up to 48 stitches, but [he's] definitely working toward a full recovery," Phillips said. "We do wish him and the RCMP member a full recovery."

Police had been called to deal

with the dogs before. In 2008, residents reported the animals were chasing people in the area. Then in June they bit two people. No one was seriously injured.

The chief and council and the tribal police ordered the owner to kill all three dogs, she added.

They were destroyed later that day.

Tribal police continue to investigate. The owner could face charges of criminal negligence, said Staff Sgt. Steve LeClair with Pemberton RCMP.

In a month and a half, council will launch a project to register dogs on the reserve, tag them and even organize a sort of dog amnesty where owners can give up dogs they can't take care of.

The ballooning dog population "has been an ongoing issue," Phillips said. "Obviously, more work remains to be done as a community and as responsible dog owners."

The "Pit Bull Dog" at 113 McKee Cr. Regina, SK

Dear Sirs:

On Wed. April 6th/2011, 5:00 pm I was on my driveway at 109 McKee Cr. when I was attacked, unprovoked, by the neighbor's pit bull dog. The dog seized my gloved left fist and it took quite an effort to get it off me. My middle finger sustained a wound and my glove had some of it ripped off. This, to me, would now categorize this dog as dangerous. The incident was reported to the Regina Police, the Regina Humane Society, and my doctor. I received a tetanus shot and had the necessary blood tests done. I was informed that the pit bull at 113 McKee had been given the latest immunization shots.

On Sept. 8th/2011, at around 8:30 pm, Darryl at 112 McKee Cr. was talking to the neighbors at 113 McKee Cr. when he was bitten on his right hand by the same pit bull. Because of the bite Darryl has been off work since and is now undergoing physiotherapy to try to get the damaged fingers so he can use them. This attack was unprovoked and the dog could be described as dangerous because of this.

Every day when I go out on my driveway next to the chainlink fence and the pit bull is on the other side of the fence he keeps jumping up and down against the fence making a lot of noise and making me very afraid. I am 83 years old and I don't think I have the strength to protect myself against this dog should he ever attack me again. I feel my freedom to enjoy life without this kind of threat is being compromised.

Is there anything that can be done to help me out?

Police Deploy CEW in Suspicious Vehicle Investigation

At approximately 1:51 p.m. on Saturday, June 27th, 2015, police were dispatched to a park in the 900 block of Broder Street for a suspicious vehicle call for service. The investigation led officers to a secluded section of the park where they observed a parked van. The officers, after approaching the van, encountered a 50 year old male who was uncooperative with officers. The male refused to comply with police demands to show his hands and exit the vehicle. The male continued to aggressively ignore police commands and reached into the back seat of his car in an attempt to grab an object. An officer present deployed and discharged a CEW, also commonly referred to as a taser. The officers located an axe and a hammer in close proximity to the area for which the male was reaching. The officers were able to take the male into custody and get him into the care of EMS from whom he received treatment. The male was unharmed and not injured as a result of the CEW deployment.

Police are not releasing the male's name at this time as this matter is still under investigation; however, police have laid charges of impaired driving and anticipate more charges once the investigation is complete.

The use of the CEW has been documented as per policy and will be reviewed by a Use of Force Committee - a committee with the Service. All uses of force are also reported to the Saskatchewan Police Commission, which is an independent body providing oversight to municipal policing in this province.







Public Complaint Process

Initiation of Public Complaint:

A member of the public may make a public complaint:

- (a) to the office of the Public Complaints Commission (PCC);
- (b) to a police service
- (c) to the Special Investigations Unit of FSIN;
- (d) to the board office of the affected police service;
- (e) to the department, or
- (f) to a detachment of the RCMP

A member of the public has 12 months to make a complaint unless PCC is satisfied that it is in the public interest to extend the ti






