Re: Tamra Keepness Investigation

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Board of Police Commissioners is continuing to offer a \$50,000 reward, until December 31, 2016, for information that leads to determining the whereabouts of Tamra Keepness.

#### **CONCLUSION**

The Regina Police Service believes continuing to offer a reward for information about the whereabouts of Tamra Keepness may elicit needed evidence.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Tamra Jewel Keepness was last seen in her home in the 1800 block of Ottawa Street in the evening hours of Monday, July 5, 2004. She was noted missing by family members during the morning hours of Tuesday, July 6, 2004. Since receiving the report of her disappearance at 12:15 p.m. Tuesday, July 6, 2004, the Regina Police Service has conducted a comprehensive search and investigation.

At a special meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners on July 13, 2004, the Board authorized a \$25,000 reward for information leading to the discovery of the location of Tamra Keepness. The closing date for the reward was originally December 31, 2004. In July 2014 the Board of Police Commissioners increased the reward to \$50,000.

The Board has previously approved the continuance of the reward in each of the subsequent years of 2005 to 2015.

#### DISCUSSION

The Regina Police Service continues its investigation into the disappearance of Tamra Keepness. However, after following through on the information received, the file has not been solved and Tamra has not been located. The missing person file of Tamra Keepness is assigned to the Cold Case Unit, where the investigation into the disappearance of Tamra Keepness continues. New information pertaining to this incident could be pivotal in bringing the investigation to a conclusion. In order to encourage people with direct knowledge to come forward, it is recommended the Board of Police Commissioners authorize the continuance of the \$50,000 reward to December 31, 2016. The governance of the reward will continue to be held with the Board. The criteria will continue as set out in 2004, with the noted change in expiry date:

The reward of FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) is to be awarded to the person, or persons, who in the sole opinion of the Board of Police Commissioners for the City of

Regina, have submitted information to the Regina Police Service, leading directly to the discovery of the whereabouts of Tamra Jewel Keepness.

Person(s) criminally culpable for the disappearance of Tamra Jewel Keepness, member(s) of the family of Tamra Jewel Keepness, and employees of law enforcement or correctional agencies are not eligible to lay claim to the reward or any portion thereof.

In the event that more than one person has submitted information that would entitle them to a share thereof, the reward will be apportioned as deemed just by the Board of Police Commissioners for the City of Regina.

This reward expires December 31, 2016.

The Regina Police Service will review the need to continue the reward beyond 2016 and make recommendations to the Board in December 2016.

- The Regina Police Service Board of Police Commissioners and the Chief of Police at their sole discretion will determine the portion of the reward to be paid to any claimant(s). Only persons who have filed a claim to the reward will be considered.

- No member of a federal, provincial or municipal police agency including full or part-time employees or volunteers, corrections agency employees, full-time or volunteers or their family members are entitled to file a claim for a reward. Persons engaged in the judicial system either as employees or contractors are excluded from claiming a reward. This also includes lawyers, employees and family members of firms that were the victim of a crime.
- Persons who provided statements to police in this investigation before a reward is offered are not eligible to claim a reward.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Police Commissioners offer a reward of \$50,000.00 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the death of Gray Nay Htoo, Maw Maw and Seven June Htoo.

The reward will expire December 31, 2016.

#### CONCLUSION

The Regina Police Service is investigating a triple homicide which occurred August 2010. The investigation will continue until all investigative avenues have been exhausted.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On August 6, 2010 the bodies of Gray Nay Htoo (31yrs), his wife, Maw Maw (28yrs) and their son, Seven June Htoo (3yrs) were located in their residence at 323 Oakview Drive. The victims were Karen refugees from a Thailand refugee camp who had lived in Regina for approximately two years. Since the beginning of the investigation one member from the RCMP was assigned. The RCMP member is of Karen descent and has lived and worked within the Regina Karen community.

There have been over 200 interviews many of which involved Karen speaking people. Karen translators were brought in from communities across Canada and one from the United States. At different points in the investigation there have been as many as 25 Regina Police Service investigators assigned as well as numerous RCMP officers.

The investigative team has worked in conjunction with various sections of the RCMP, the FBI and other police services utilizing multiple police investigative techniques to gather substantial evidence.

In July 2015 the file and investigation was assigned to the Regina Police Service Cold Case Coordinator. The Cold Case Coordinators' responsibility is to continue the investigation, follow-up on any outstanding tasks and follow-up on any new information which comes to light.

#### DISCUSSION

The Regina Police Service continues to hold the murders of Gray Nay Htoo, Maw Maw Htoo and Seven June Htoo as a priority. The investigation has been ongoing since August 6, 2010. The team investigating the murders was made up of five investigators. This team was dedicated full time to the investigation. The investigators had ongoing meetings with the Crown Prosecutors who had been assigned to the file.

Persons of interest have been identified and several investigative avenues have been used. The investigators believe there are people within the community who have information which could be crucial to this investigation and bring it to a successful conclusion. The investigators have reached out to engage the Karen community to meet, in order to build a better understanding. The meetings have been to share information with respect to the Canadian justice system; the role of police and role of the courts. The attempt is to demystify policing in Canada versus the Refugee Camp Security system. The community has been receptive to the dialogue and has participated in the meetings; asking questions, providing support to the efforts of the investigators. The investigators believe the continuation of the reward may stimulate more information to come forward, especially given the education and outreach that the investigators have done.

The Regina Police Service will review the need to continue the reward beyond 2016 and make recommendations to the Board in December 2016.

Re: Trespass to Property Initiative – 6-month review

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Receive and File.

#### CONCLUSION

The Regina Police Service is working proactively with businesses to help address the issue of unwanted guests on their property. The Trespass to Property Initiative was implemented in the Spring of 2015. This initiative empowers businesses to ban individuals who are repeatedly disruptive at the business by being intoxicated, harassing customers, shoplifting, or engaging in other unruly behaviour. The process is allowed under current legislation. Once a person is banned, police officers can issue Summary Offence tickets to those who ignore the ban. The Regina Police Service has educated business owners on this process, particularly in the downtown area. This initiative has now been implemented for six-months. This year, disturbance related incidents in the downtown area have decreased by 18% compared to the same six-month period in 2014.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Regina's downtown is a highly populated area. Some individuals who frequent the downtown area have been the source of a disproportionately high number of police calls for service for public intoxication, harassing customers, shoplifting, or engaging in other unruly behaviour.

In early 2015, the Regina Police Service responded to this community concern by implementing the Trespass to Property Initiative. This initiative utilizes legislation under *The Trespass to Property Act* to address unruly and disruptive conduct at businesses. Specifically, section 3 enables police to issue a summary offence ticket to individuals who attend a business after being issued a ban prohibiting them from doing so. In the event that an individual continues to violate a ban, officers may utilize the Mischief section of *The Criminal Code* to further reinforce these sanctions.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Some individuals who frequent Regina's downtown area are responsible for generating a disproportionately high number of police calls for service involving disturbance type events. These disturbance calls have been steadily increasing. In 2012 there were 2,508 calls for service in the downtown area. These calls increased by 4% in 2013 to 2,607 calls for service, and increased again in 2014 by another 16% to 3,033 calls for service.

In early 2015, the Regina Police Service responded to the increasing number of disturbances in the downtown area by implementing the Trespass to Property Initiative; providing better collaboration between businesses and police. If required, participating businesses can issue a ban to an individual who engages in a prohibited activity as described in *The Trespass to* 

Property Act. If a ban has been issued and the banned individual fails to abide by it, police can issue a ticket under *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990*. In the event that an individual continues to violate a business ban, officers may be able to utilize the Mischief section of *The Criminal Code* to further reinforce these sanctions. As a result of this collaborative initiative, incidents involving disturbances in and around downtown businesses have decreased by 18% compared to the same time period in 2014.

A number of participating businesses have issued ban forms to individuals but have not yet submitted them to the Regina Police Service. Some business owners are only contacting police if the individual disobeys the ban and returns to the business. Since launching the initiative, the Regina Police Service has received 136 ban forms and issued 38 Summary Offence Tickets under *The Trespass to Property Act*, in other words, only 28% of the ban forms received by police have resulted in tickets. Lastly, police have laid 1 Mischief charge under *The Criminal Code* in relation to the initiative.

The feedback from businesses and other participating organizations has been very positive. Most have reported that once a ban form has been issued, there are few incidents of recidivism.

#### RECOMMENDATION

#### CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of November 2015 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of [-3.3%] compared to November 2014, while Crimes Against Property show a 5.8% increase compared to November 2014. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 4.0%.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of November 2015. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

#### DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect an increase of 548 reported incidents over 2014, for an overall year-to-date increase of 5.8%. We have seen a decrease of [-11] reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a [-0.3%] decrease. There are 165 more reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a 7.5% increase.

Thefts of Auto rates have increased by 147 incidents for an overall increase of 19.4% in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of [-79] fewer incidents over November 2014 for a [-3.3%] decrease. There were 24 reported Robberies in November for a year-to-date increase of 15 incidents or an increase of 7.3%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 469 more reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2015 over 2014 for a 4.0% increase.

There were a total of 6,284 dispatched Calls for Service in November for a year-to-date increase of 1.6% and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of [-15.5%].

#### **CONCLUSION**

#### **BACKGROUND**

The purpose of this report is to facilitate the establishment of 2016 regular meeting dates for the Board of Police Commissioners.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Board of Police Commissioners should establish its regular meeting schedule for 2016, with the dates selected:

- to avoid conflict with other scheduled meetings, such as the Executive Committee
- to fit the schedules of Board members.

At the December 2014 meeting, the Board approved its meeting dates for 2015, including its first meeting for 2016, which was scheduled for January 20. It is now proposed to reschedule this meeting to Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. so that December Crime Statistics will be available.

Due to the Civic Election on October 26, 2016, a meeting has not been scheduled for October; however, should the need for a meeting arise, a special meeting will be scheduled, when needed.

Based on the above and a review of the regular meeting dates of the Board of Police Commissioners held last year, it is proposed that regular meetings for 2016 be held on the following dates at 9:00 a.m.:

February 24	July 27
March 30	August 31
April 27	September 28
May 25	November 30
June 29	December 21

It is also proposed that the Board of Police Commissioners select a date for its first meeting in January 2017. It is proposed the Board hold its first meeting of 2017 on Wednesday, January 25 at 9:00 a.m.

A calendar which lists the above dates and the approved meeting dates for City Council is attached as Appendix "A".
