CONCLUSION


Regina's total crime was higher in the first half of 2016 than it has been since 2012, driven primarily by increases in property crimes. However, the counts in almost all crime categories have been substantially lower in 2016 than during the same period of time in 2007.

BACKGROUND

Twice each year, once at mid-year and once at year-end, the Regina Police Service provides an analysis of police-reported crime¹ in Regina over the previous ten-year period. This report compares data compiled from January 1 to June 30 for the period of 2007 through 2016. The Regina Police Service gathers data in the same manner each year, allowing for reliable analyses of crime within the city over time.

DISCUSSION

There were 3.1% more reported Total Crimes² at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 20.5% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




¹ Absolute crime counts, rather than crime rates or crime severity, are the basis of this analysis. These statistics are not intended for comparison with other jurisdictions that may use different methodologies or have different reporting criteria.

² Included in Total Crime are Crimes Against the Person, Crimes Against Property, and Other Criminal Code violations.



Crimes Against the Person


There were 1.9% fewer reported Crimes Against the Person at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 24.1% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




The 4 Homicides at mid-year 2016 were comparable to the mean average for the ten-year period ($\bar{x} = 3.8$). However, the 14 Attempted Murders were much higher than the ten-year mean average ($\bar{x} = 5.5$).



There were 3.1% fewer total Assaults reported at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 16.7% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




The 61 Sexual Assaults reported at mid-year 2016 were lower than the ten-year mean average ($\bar{x} = 66.3$) while the 22 reported Other Sex Crimes³ were higher than the ten-year average ($\bar{x} = 12.3$).






There were 2.7% fewer Robberies reported at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 53.6% fewer than at mid-year 2007.



The 2 reported occurrences of Kidnapping / Forcible Confinement at mid-year 2016 was lower than the ten-year mean average ($\bar{x} = 8.8$).




The 13 reported Criminal Harassment / Stalking occurrences at mid-year 2016 was lower than the ten-year mean average ($\bar{x} = 16.6$).




Crimes Against Property


There were 17.7% more reported Crimes Against Property at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 22.4% fewer than at mid-year 2007.



There were 50.0% more Theft of Motor Vehicles at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 21.0% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




Theft⁴ comprises about one-quarter of Total Crime in Regina each year. There were 13.9% more Thefts at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 12.1% fewer than at mid-year 2007. Of the theft offences in 2016, 45% were Theft from Auto.




There were 9.5% more reported Break and Enters at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 54.1% fewer than at mid-year 2007.



There were 7.6% more reported Mischief / Willful Damage occurrences at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 29.2% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




The 89 reported Arson incidents at mid-year 2016 was over twice as high as the ten-year mean average ($\bar{x} = 38.7$).




Other Criminal Code Violations

There were 21.6% fewer Other Criminal Code violations⁵ at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 10.8% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




⁵ The crime category Other Criminal Code Violations includes: procedural violations, offensive weapons violations, prostitution, counterfeiting currency, and gaming and betting.


About 9 in 10 Other Criminal Code violations are Procedural Offences. There were 18.7% fewer Procedural Offences at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 2.1% fewer than at mid-year 2007.




There has been 1 charge of Prostitution in the first half of 2016, which falls well below the tenyear mean average ($\bar{x} = 40.3$).



There were 0.4% fewer CDSA occurrences at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 but 13.4% more than at mid-year 2007.




Total Traffic Violations⁶ decreased by 3.3% compared to mid-year 2015 but increased by 28.7% compared to mid-year 2007.



⁶ Total Traffic Violations includes those offences that fall under the *Criminal Code of Canada* and the Provincial *Highway Traffic Act*.


There were 5.0% more traffic tickets issued⁷ at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 28.2% more than at mid-year 2007.



Calls for Service

There were 2.2% fewer Calls for Service at mid-year 2016 than at mid-year 2015 and 0.3% fewer than at mid-year 2007.

There were 18.4% fewer Alarm calls than at mid-year 2015 and 47.8% fewer than in 2007. Legislation regarding responsible alarm use was brought into force after a peak in 2005⁸.



⁷ Included are traffic stops and red light camera tickets. Not included are tickets generated through the Automated Speed Enforcement (photo enforcement) program.

⁸ There were 5,124 Alarm calls at mid-year 2005, which is over twice as many as were received in the first half of 2016.

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of June 2016 reflect a decrease in Crimes Against the Person of [-1.9%] compared to June 2015, while Crimes Against Property show a 17.7% increase compared to June 2015. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 13.6%.

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of June 2016. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect an increase of 826 reported incidents over 2015, for an overall year-to-date increase of 17.7%. We have seen an increase of 284 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a 13.9% increase. There are 82 more reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a 7.6% increase.

Thefts of Auto rates have increased by 181 incidents for an overall increase of 50.0% in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date decrease of [-23] incidents over June 2015 for a [-1.9%] decrease. There were 18 reported Robberies in June for a year-to-date decrease of [-3] incidents or a decrease of [-2.7%].

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 803 more reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2016 over 2015 for a 13.6% increase.

There were a total of 5,462 dispatched Calls for Service in June for a year-to-date decrease of [-2.2%] and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of [-18.4%].




Male Charged in 2014 Homicide
