RECOMMENDATION

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of July 2016 reflect an increase in Crimes Against the Person of 0.6% compared to July 2015, while Crimes Against Property show a 17.4% increase compared to July 2015. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date increase of 13.9%.

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of July 2016. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Crimes Against Property reflect an increase of 1,002 reported incidents over 2015, for an overall year-to-date increase of 17.4%. We have seen an increase of 390 reported incidents of Theft Under \$5000 for a 15.6% increase. There are 115 more reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for an 8.8% increase.

Thefts of Auto rates have increased by 153 incidents for an overall increase of 30.9% in our year-to-date statistics. The Regina Police Service in conjunction with its partners in the Stolen Auto Strategy continues to pay constant attention to this issue.

Crimes Against the Person reflect a year-to-date increase of 9 incidents over July 2015 for a 0.6% increase. There were 23 reported Robberies in July for a year-to-date increase of 2 incidents or an increase of 1.4%.

Overall the Regina Police Service has received 1,011 more reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined in 2016 over 2015 for a 13.9% increase.

There were a total of 6,004 dispatched Calls for Service in July for a year-to-date decrease of [-1.6%] and Alarm Calls for Service show a year-to-date decrease of [-17.4%].

I was unable to get a plate number or vehicle make due to the speed at which the vehicle flew past me.

Over the next 30 minutes, this vehicle made at least 6 high speed passes down the same block. I noticed it parked in a driveway at _________, so I walked down and took a picture. I now had the plate number, vehicle make and model, as well as the location of the vehicle, so I called RPS with this information.

I was very impressed with how RPS handled this complaint; from the communications person I spoke to on the phone, to the officers who came to the scene. I'm sure that patrol officers have

a never ending list of calls they could attend to on a warm Saturday evening in July, but a patrol vehicle arrived soon after my call.

Officer Anita Robinson called my cell phone and asked me to walk back to the scene and provide a statement. As I approached, she was dealing with several people in the backyard at this house in a firm manner; I do believe alcohol was a factor at this backyard party. Officer Robinson quickly changed her demeanor and dealt with me in a pleasant and polite manner. While I wrote out my statement in the patrol vehicle, Officer Robinson's partner Jason checked with other residents on the street; some of whom had also seen or heard the speeding vehicle.

The decision was made to seize the vehicle, a decision which did not sit well with the people at the backyard party.

I am thankful the officers chose to remove this dangerous vehicle from the streets of Regina. Hopefully the owner of the vehicle will learn a lesson from this incident; a lesson where the cost can be measured with dollars, and not with injuries or worse.

In this age of social media, some people in society are quick to condem the actions of police officers after seeing a short video clip, but before they know the whole story. Credit where credit is due; Officer Robinson and her partner Jason took my concerns seriously, and did their jobs in a professional manner.

Thanks again to you and your department for keeping Regina a safe and secure city to live in.

Our flags are at half-mast today to express our sympathy for the families of the deceased officers in Dallas, Texas, the injured victims and their colleagues.

This is a very tragic event...as is any violence that takes lives and causes injuries. These acts change people's lives forever. We are shocked and saddened by this event, and extend our deepest sympathy to all involved.

In terms of what it may mean to our police service...we don't know enough about the events in Dallas to try and analyze from a distance and offer comment. We will stay connected to this event as observers, and our hearts go out to our neighbours to the south. We will seek to learn in the coming days what the local or national implications for policing might be.

We are certain it does have an emotional impact on our people who work daily in law enforcement, and their families. We will pay attention to ensure they remain healthy and well.

We obviously watch and follow events like this very closely as we are in the business of being vigilant to any expression of violence or acts of violence in our community, whatever the motivation may be.
